Art Meets History in New Exhibit at the St. Augustine Art Association Gallery

The nationwide exhibit features artists' inspiration in the history of their communities.

St. Augustine, Fla. (July 12, 2024) – On Florida's Historic Coast, one of the country's oldest art associations is celebrating its centennial with a unique exhibit that challenges artists to picture their community in a new light.

The Association attracted artists to St. Augustine by promoting it as "just like painting in Europe," creating a vibrant colony of creatives.

Visitors looking to explore art and architecture can find over 46 homes downtown listed on the National Historic Landmark Registry. St. Augustine's <u>Black History App</u> provides a digital pocket guide to the important locations with accompanying historical information. Visitors with visual impairments can experience a tactile tour of St. Augustine's public art installations and history through <u>Touch St. Augustine</u>, a touchable art exhibit with braille plaques in the Plaza de la Constitución.
